# Ministry of Health & Family Welfare Launches Mission Indradhanush

Full immunization coverage to be expanded from 65% to at least 90% children of the country.

All vaccines are available free of cost under the Universal Immunization Programme in India

### Mission Indradhanush

Mission Indradhanush was launched by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MOHFW) Government of India with the objective to ensure that all children under the age of two years as well as pregnant women are fully immunized with seven vaccine preventable diseases.

The Mission Indradhanush, depicting seven colours of the rainbow, targets to immunize all children against seven vaccine preventable diseases, namely:

- 1. Diphtheria
- 2. Pertussis (Whooping Cough)
- 3. Tetanus
- 4. Tuberculosis
- 5. Polio
- Hepatitis B
- 7. Measles.

### The main highlights of the first phase of Mission Indradhanush are as given below:

- Total 9.4 lakh sessions were organized during these four rounds of Mission Indradhanush
- About 2crore vaccines were given to the children as well as pregnant women.
- Tetanus Toxoid vaccine was given to more than 20 lakh pregnant women
- 75.5 lakh children were vaccinated and about 20 lakh children were fully vaccinated.
- More than 57 lakh zinc tablets and 16 lakh ORS packets were freely distributed to all the children to protect them against diarrhoea.
