







Guidance Note – Intensified IEC Campaign 2025**Background:**

India faces a significant health challenge with HIV/AIDS, being the country with the second highest number of people living with HIV (PLHIV) in the world. Even though the national HIV prevalence is low, as of 2023, there are approximately 25.44 lakh PLHIV in India, with 68,450 new HIV infections reported in the past year. Certain states have shown a rising trend in HIV prevalence which is attributed to multiple routes of transmission. The categorization of districts based on HIV prevalence indicates that the number of high-priority districts has increased from 156 in 2007 to 178 in 2022, highlighting the expanding epidemic and the necessity for targeted interventions.

In order to enhance the knowledge levels of general population and equip masses with information about HIV & Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs) across the country, a two month – “Intensified IEC Campaign” spearheaded by NACO was launched on 12th August 2025 on the occasion of International Youth Day across all the States and UTs. The campaign conducted in close coordination with other line departments could reach out to a large number of villages and individuals with information related to prevention and control of HIV as well as stigma and discrimination associated with HIV/AIDS. The key achievement of the IIC 2024-25 is provided in the table below:

Based on the experience and success of the campaign, it is proposed 2nd round of Intensified IEC Campaign 2025-26 (IIC) on HIV/AIDS Prevention & Control to raise awareness about HIV among the General Population across the nation.

Objectives:

The key objectives of the IIC 2025-26 are:

- i. To promote awareness about the 'routes of transmission of HIV.
- ii. To promote literacy on the HIV and AIDS (Prevention & Control) Act 2017 to address stigma and discrimination towards people infected and affected by HIV/AIDS.
- iii. To promote awareness of HIV and Syphilis among pregnant women/ANC attendees
- iv. To create demand for services such as testing for HIV, condom, STI services and promote other services under NACP including the National AIDS Toll-free Helpline 1097.

- v. To strengthen collaboration between various Government departments at State, District, Block and village level administration to promote awareness regarding HIV/AIDS.

Details of Urban level Activities:

- a) **State Level Launch Event – Chief Minister / Health Minister to do the official launch:** The campaign will be officially inaugurated with a high-profile launch event, led by the Chief Minister or Health Minister. This flagship event will be widely publicized to ensure maximum visibility and impact. It will feature keynote speeches underscoring the critical importance of HIV and STI awareness, powerful testimonies from individuals affected by these conditions, and the formal unveiling of campaign materials. This high-level political endorsement is intended to galvanize public interest, inspire community engagement, and strengthen support for the campaign's objectives.
- b) **Press Conference and Press Release for the launch at State level:** A press conference needs to be organized to coincide with the launch event, featuring key stakeholders such as State Government officials, healthcare professionals, and representatives from civil society. A detailed press release will be distributed to media, providing comprehensive information about the campaign objectives, planned activities, and expected outcomes. This media engagement will help in amplifying the campaign's reach and encouraging media coverage throughout its duration.
- c) **Rally :** Rallies to be organized in major cities and towns to mobilize community participation and raise awareness. These rallies to feature banners, placards, and slogans promoting HIV and STI awareness, safe practices, and stigma reduction. Participation from schools, colleges, NGOs, and local communities will be encouraged to ensure widespread involvement. The rallies will serve as a visible demonstration of community solidarity and commitment to the campaign's goals.
- d) **Social Media campaign (Eight-week) :** An intensive eight-week social media campaign to run concurrently at the state and district levels, utilizing platforms like Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, and local social networks. Besides creation of customized content, States can also adapt national content to reflect regional languages and cultural nuances. The campaign will include daily posts to maintain high engagement. The week-wise thematic areas to follow will be provided by NACO.
- e) **Special Camps at Government Hospitals (State & District level):** Special camps in government hospitals across states and districts hospitals to provide free HIV/STI testing, counselling, and treatment services. Standees and hoardings/banners to be set-up in the hospital vicinity. These camps will be well-publicized through local media, social media, and community networks to ensure high turnout. NACP staff

will also distribute educational materials and provide information on available healthcare services, reinforcing the campaign's educational component.

- f) **Slum Interventions:** Targeted activities need be carried out in urban slums, where populations are often at higher risk and have less access to healthcare services. These interventions will include door-to-door visits by NACP field functionaries, distribution of pamphlets, and organization of small group discussions to address myths and provide accurate information about HIV and STIs. Partnerships with local NGOs and community leaders will be crucial for successful implementation.
- g) **Folk Performances & Flash Mobs :** Utilizing popular and traditional forms of entertainment, folk performances and flash mobs will be organized in public spaces to draw attention to the campaign. These performances will convey key messages about HIV and STI prevention, stigma reduction, and safe practices in an engaging and memorable manner. Besides the empanelled troupes for folk and recognized groups for flash mobs, collaborations with local artists and cultural groups will ensure authenticity and local appeal.
- h) **Community Radio:** Community radio stations will be leveraged to broadcast campaign messages, including interviews with health experts, success stories, and information on available services. These broadcasts will be tailored to local languages and cultural contexts, ensuring they resonate with the target audiences. Interactive segments such as call-in shows will provide listeners with opportunities to ask questions and receive reliable information.
- i) **Awareness sessions in colleges:** SACS to host awareness sessions to educate young adults about HIV and STIs in colleges and universities. These sessions will include lectures, interactive workshops, and distribution of informational materials. Peer educators and students from RRC colleges will play a key role in facilitating these sessions, ensuring that the messages are relatable and impactful for the youth.
- j) **Sensitization for Ombudsman & Complaints Officers:** Special sensitization workshops will be conducted for ombudsman and complaints officers to ensure they are well-equipped to handle HIV/STI-related grievances with sensitivity and confidentiality. These sessions will cover the legal rights of individuals, anti-discrimination policies, and effective complaint resolution mechanisms as per the provisions under the HIV & AIDS (Prevention & Control) Act 2017, fostering a supportive environment for those affected by HIV and STIs.

Details of Rural level Activities:

- a. **Village level meeting on HIV & STI Awareness:** To enhance public awareness and community engagement on HIV and Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs), it has been directed that village-level awareness meetings be organized in a targeted 90,000 villages, based on population density, across 600 districts. The initiative will

be carried out under the overall supervision of the Project Director, State AIDS Control Society (SACS), in coordination with the District HIV/AIDS Coordination Unit (DAPCU)/DISHA, in collaboration with the Zilla Parishad and Gram Panchayats.

Key Instructions:

- **Village Selection:** Priority should be given to villages with higher population density. The number of villages to be covered will be as per the Annual Action Plan. The State AIDS Control Society (SACS) may take support from the DAPCU and DISHA teams to finalize the list of target villages. It is also suggested that SACS prioritize villages that were not covered during last year's intensified campaign.
 - **Stakeholder Involvement:** Gram Panchayat heads, ASHAs, ANMs, and local NGOs should be engaged to mobilize the community and facilitate participation.
 - **Scheduling:** Meetings should be scheduled in alignment with existing Gram Sabha dates, health camps, or other local events to ensure maximum outreach.
 - **Content Delivery:** Awareness sessions must cover:
 - Basic knowledge on HIV/STIs, prevention and treatment
 - Importance of early testing and available health services
 - Addressing stigma and promoting inclusive behaviour
- b. School Outreach Programme in villages:** Sessions on HIV awareness should be conducted in senior secondary schools (Classes 8th to 10th) and through inter-school activities to educate students. Field staff, NYKS functionaries, and Red Ribbon Club (RRC) members will be responsible for conducting the village-level meetings. It is also recommended that the State AIDS Control Society (SACS) prioritize schools that were not covered during last year's intensified campaign.
- c. Disseminating Information on HIV & STIs at AB-HWCs in Villages through IEC Materials:** IEC materials on HIV and STIs should be prominently displayed at Ayushman Aarogya Mandirs (AB-HWCs). A combination of visual aids—such as pamphlets, posters, and other informative tools—should be utilized to ensure that the content is accessible, engaging, and easily understood by all visitors.
- IPC Sessions during Village Health, Sanitation, and Nutrition Day (VHSND):** Interpersonal Communication (IPC) sessions should be conducted during VHSND to educate couples on the elimination of vertical transmission of HIV and syphilis. These sessions should emphasize the shared roles and responsibilities of both partners in preventing transmission and promoting maternal and child health.



Suggestive Strategy for the Campaign:

- 1) Official Communication from AS & DG, NACO to the PD, SACS of all States & UT's
- 2) Official Letter from Principal Secretary, Health to DC/DM
- 3) Official communication from DC/DM to Block Development Officers (BDOs)
- 4) State Level Launch Event – Chief Minister / Health Minister to do the official launch
- 5) DM/DCs to conduct a meeting with Block Development Officers (BDOs) about the campaign for ensuring maximum participation for village level activities.
- 6) State to line-list the villages to be covered through the campaign by the field functionaries. Each field functionary to cover 5 -10 villages over the campaign period of two months.

Campaign Reporting:

- 1) Periodicity – Weekly
- 2) DISHA & DAPCU to coordinate with the concern villages to collect the information on no. of activities conducted and population reached
- 3) On weekly basis IEC Division will submit the compiled report for perusal of leadership at NACO as per standardized template

**Role of DAPCU/DISHA Units:**

- 1) **Coordination:**
DAPCU/DISHA units will coordinate with local government bodies such as Zilla Parishad and Gram Panchayat, under the supervision of the Project Director of SACS. They will ensure that all planned activities are carried out effectively at the district and village levels in coordination with SACS.
- 2) **Monitoring & Reporting:**
DAPCU/DISHA units will collect data for the village level activities and report on the activities conducted and the population reached to SACS on a weekly basis. They

will submit weekly reports to the SACS for review and analysis, helping to track the progress and effectiveness of the campaign.

3) Support in Implementation and Community Engagement:

DAPCU/DISHA units will support implementation of activities aimed at raising awareness and educating the public about HIV/STIs through this campaign. This includes organizing village-level meetings, school outreach programs, special camps at hospitals, and engaging the community through cultural and educational events. They will collaborate with local NGOs, community leaders, and other stakeholders to ensure broad participation and reach for the campaign.

Documentation of Best Practices/Outlying Initiatives:

- 1) Compilation of success stories
- 2) IEC messaging recommendations
- 3) Propelling sustained momentum
- 4) Recognition and acknowledgements

Execution Plan: The State AIDS Control Societies (SACS) will be responsible for systematically documenting and presenting notable achievements and breakthroughs to highlight effective strategies undertaken during the campaign. SACS will craft newer recommendations on IEC messaging with clear and impactful communication strategies to convey key information and foster understanding among the general population post-campaign. To propel sustained momentum, SACS will maintain consistent efforts in enhancing awareness of HIV & STIs beyond the campaign period. Additionally, SACS will ensure recognition and acknowledgments of the efforts made by State, District, and Field functionaries and teams, honoring their contributions to foster motivation and reinforce a culture of excellence and achievement.

- T-shirts, umbrellas, mufflers, and tiles will be provided by HPSACS.
- Colleges will arrange paints and other required materials and share bills with HPSACS for reimbursement.
- Any other colleges requiring materials should share their requirements by **22nd July 2025**, with HPSACS for timely arrangement.

5. NCC and NSS Cadets Participation for Discipline Management

All colleges and institutions having NCC and NSS units will depute maximum cadets possible for managing discipline during the function.

Directions for the same will be issued by both the Higher Education Department and the NCC Directorate.

6. Walkathon by Youth

Two walkathons will be organized from:

- Govt. ITI Shimla

- Walkathons will be flagged off by college principals.
- One or two HPSACS officials will coordinate with the colleges.
