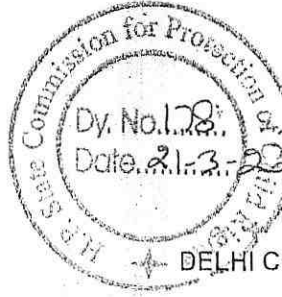

*National Conference on the Best Practices in Schools*  
Call for Papers

With the intent of strengthening and protecting child rights, the Delhi Commission for Protection of Child Rights has been taking necessary steps and examining factors that inhibit the enjoyment of those rights.

To gain insights on how the teachers' innovative pedagogical practices, principals' orientation towards building inclusive rules and processes, parents' support, officials' empathetic approach, and civil society organisations' research, and advocacy across various states in India have been managing to do the excellent work in this field, the Commission may call on a conference on 01/05/2020 (tentatively) to bring together all the stakeholders and share insights on the quality of life and education of children.

The conference may have the following themes and have multiple formats like panel discussion, workshops, sharing of best practices and paper presentation:

1. Social Inclusion In Schools- The paper must address systemic, processes and pedagogical barriers and solutions to effectively integrate children from diverse social backgrounds. This is particularly critical in the light of Section 12(1)(c) of Right to Free and Compulsory Education Act, 2009 that mandates all private schools to admit, for 25% of its seats, the children belonging to socially and economically weaker sections.
2. Children's Behaviour Management Practices- This paper must address the different disciplining techniques for positively influencing the behaviours of children without resorting to physical or mental violence of any kind. The paper may address specific parenting techniques or classroom management techniques.
3. Community & Parental Engagement- It is critical that parents, the school and larger society collaborate and contribute to overall development of the children. This paper must address specific case studies, or success stories wherein the School Management Committees (or any other formal or informal space for parents and schools to collaborate) have effectively sought to monitor and improve the functioning of the schools making it an enabling space for holistic growth of children.

4. Bridging Learning Deficit- Learning is a key component to lift the generation out of poverty and it is a struggle to bridge this gap within a time frame that is justified for the current generation of students. This paper must address issues, observations, and most importantly- innovations to bridge this gap. The paper may address relevant case studies and good practices in India or in the Indian context.

Selected papers shall be invited to be presented at the conference and published in the DCPCR newsletter.

1. The papers may be submitted in not more than 4000 words.
  2. The word limit shall include footnotes.
  3. Deadline for final submission of full paper, along with its abstract- 12.04.2020. No paper shall be accepted after the deadline.


